



AMENDATORY ENDORSEMENT IOWA

 Under the Common Policy Conditions, Cancellation is deleted and replaced by the following:

Cancellation -- "You" may cancel this policy by returning the policy to "us" or by giving "us" a written notice and stating at what future date coverage is to stop.

If this policy has been in effect for less than 60 days and is not a renewal of a policy issued by "us", "we" may cancel this policy, or one or more of its parts, for any reason by giving written notice of cancellation.

If this policy has been in effect for 60 days or more, or if it is a renewal of a policy issued by "us", "we" may cancel this policy only if one or more of the following reasons apply:

- a. nonpayment of premium;
- misrepresentation or fraud made by "you" or with "your" knowledge in obtaining the policy or contract, when renewing the policy or contract, or in presenting a claim under the policy or contract;
- c. actions by "you" which substantially change or increase the riskinsured;
- a determination by the Commissioner that the continuation of the policy will jeopardize "our" solvency or will constitute a violation of the law of this state or any other state;
- e. "you" have acted in a manner which
 "you" knew or should have known was in
 violation or breach of a policy or contract
 "term" or condition; or
- f. "we" lose reinsurance that provides coverage to "us" for a significant portion of the underlying risk insured, if the Commissioner determines that cancellation is justified.

The notice of cancellation will state the time that the cancellation is to take effect and include the reason for cancellation. The notice will be mailed or delivered at least ten days before cancellation is effective for any reason other than loss of reinsurance. If the cancellation is due to loss of reinsurance, notice will be mailed or delivered at least 30 days before the cancellation is effective.

The notice will be sent to "you" and any loss payee at the last mailing addresses known to "us". If the notice of cancellation is mailed to "you", a U.S. Post Office Certificate of Mailing will be sufficient proof of receipt of the mailing. However, a certificate of mailing is not required if cancellation is for nonpayment of premium.

If "you" cancel, "your" return premium, if any, will be calculated according to "our" rules. If "we" cancel, "your" return premium, if any, will be calculated on a pro rata basis. It will be refunded to "you" with the cancellation notice or within a reasonable time. Payment or tender of the unearned premium is not a condition of cancellation.

2. Under the Common Policy Conditions, the following condition is added:

Nonrenewal -- If "we" decide not to renew this policy, "we" will give notice of nonrenewal at least 45 days prior to the expiration of the policy.

The notice will be sent to "you" and any loss payee at the last mailing addresses known to "us". If the notice of nonrenewal is mailed to "you", a U.S. Post Office Certificate of Mailing will be sufficient proof of receipt of the mailing.

3. Under the Common Policy Conditions, the following condition is added:

Renewal -- If "we" decide to renew this policy subject to:

- a. an increase in premium of 25% or more: or
- b. an increase in deductible of 25% or more; or
- a material reduction in the "limits" or coverage of the policy;

"we" will mail an explanation of the changes to "you" at least 45 days prior to the expiration of the policy period, along with an offer to renew this policy subject to the described changes.

If "we" offer to renew or continue and "you" do not accept, this Policy will terminate at the end of the current policy period. Failure to pay the required renewal or continuation premium when due shall mean that "you" have not accepted our offer.

A premium change which is assessed after the beginning date of the policy period for which the premium is due is not a premium increase under item a. above.

If "we" fail to meet the notice requirements set forth above, "you" have the option of continuing this policy for the remainder of the notice period plus an additional 30 days at its current premium rate.



RE: FY 2023-2024 Budget

On behalf of the staff for the City of Keokuk, I present the FY 2023-2024 budget. This document is perhaps the most important action taken by the city in any given year. The budget should reflect the goals and priorities of the City Council, as well as the needs and wants of our citizens. While not all inclusive, I believe that the budget is an accurate representation of the Council's vision for Keokuk.

This has been a difficult year for cities across lowa, not just Keokuk. The residential rollback, the percentage of valuation we are allowed to tax residential property, was originally set to increase from 54.13% to 56.49%. However, the State made an error in their calculations related to multifamily housing's rollback percentage, resulting in the Legislature correcting the error by setting the rollback at 54.65%. This change resulted in revenue reductions to the General Fund and TIF Fund. Other property tax revenues can set levy rates as needed and did not suffer revenue reductions but did see increases in their levy rates.

This is also the first year of the Business Commercial Tax Rebate (BCTR). Commercial and industrial properties have the first \$150,000 of valuation taxed at the residential rate. Previously, businesses had to apply for the rebate that was then issued by the counties to the business. Under the new law, the valuation is automatically applied to all businesses. The result was a decrease in taxable valuations. The State does rebate the lost revenue back to cities, but the reduction in the rollback decreased the amount received.

Due to the changes in valuations, the city's 100% valuations increased by approximately \$13 million, while the taxable valuations decreased by approximately \$16 million. General Fund tax receipts, including the Emergency Levy, were reduced by \$55,108. The BCTR revenue is projected to be \$125,000 for the General Fund and Emergency Levy combined, offsetting some of the loss in tax revenue. The General Fund is expected to have a surplus of \$34,991 for FY 24, however, \$100,000 is being expended from reserves for the River Front Trail affecting the bottom line. These funds were received in FY 23, but with the trail delayed until fall of 2024 were not expended in FY 23.

With the loss in sewer charges from ADM, debt service paid with sewer revenues has been converted to general obligation debt. This has significantly increased the total levy rate going from \$18.95458/1,000 to \$22.97101/thousand. Reserves from the Employee Benefits fund in the amount of \$143,606 are being used to reduce the levy for FY 24. Payback of the Capital Equipment/Project Bond of \$1 million will occur in FY 24 to replace the reserves from Employee Benefits for FY 25.

Special Revenues show expenditures over revenues of \$664,544. Of that amount, \$550,000 is ARPA expenditures for the 600 block buildings, building demolitions, and the CDBG Pilot Project. Capital

Projects ending balance reflects the S 18th Street project, without additional grant revenues. Should those grants be awarded the bottom line will improve.

Sewer revenues include a 10% increase in residential rates. This is the first increase since 2018 and represents a less than 2% increase over the last six years. Sewer expenditures, excluding capital projects, have been reduced by \$1.677 million.

This document would not be possible without the assistance of the department heads and department managers. They have helped to provide good estimates and measure their requests against the impact to available funds. All staff members have shown due diligence in controlling expenses while exceeding service levels. I thank them all for their hard work.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF KEOKUK, LEE COUNTY, IOWA BY REZONING LOTS 7, 8 AND 9 IN THE ORIGINAL CITY OF KEOKUK, LEE COUNTY, IOWA FROM R-3, TWO FAMILY DWELLING DISTRICT TO A M-1, LIGHT INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KEOKUK, LEE COUNTY IOWA;

Section 1. The zoning ordinances of the City of Keokuk, Lee County, Iowa are hereby amended by rezoning the following described real estate from R-3, two family dwelling districts to an M-1, light industrial district to wit:

DESCRIPTION

Lots 7, 8 and 9, Block 33, Original City of Keokuk, Lee County, Iowa and more specifically described by the following description:

Beginning at the centerline where Timea Street and South 5th Street intersect, thence northeasterly one-hundred and eighty-three feet (183') along the centerline of South 5th Street, thence southeasterly one-hundred and eighty-three feet (183') along the centerline of the alley, thence southwesterly one-hundred and eighty- three feet (183') along the southerly property line of lot 9 to the center of Timea Street thence northwesterly one-hundred and eighty-three (183') along the center line of Timea Street to the point of beginning.

SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its final passage and publication, once in the Daily Gate City, a newspaper of general circulation, as required by law.

SECTION 3. REPEALER CLAUSE

All other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

It is hereby declared to be the intent of the City Council that this ordinance would have been enacted as if such illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional section, sentence, clause, part, provision, or other subdivision had not been included herein.

RE: Rezoning request

C.L.M.M. Enterprises LLC is requesting that Lots 7, 8 and 9 in Block 33, Original City of Keokuk be rezoned from R-3, Two family dwelling district to an M-1 light industrial district to construct two 40' x 131' self-storage units at this location. There are two single family homes in this half block, 415 Timea is occupied and 407 Timea has been vacant for many years.

In 2014 a request to rezone lots 1 through 6 in block 33 was granted to construct a self-storage unit. There are still two occupied single-family dwellings in that half block, both are occupied.

The City Planning Commissions has the duty to review and recommend to the City Council amendments, supplements, changes, or modifications to the zoning regulations, restrictions, and boundaries of districts.

I have attached an aerial map indicating the current zoning within the surrounding neighborhood. Neighboring property owners within 200 feet of these parcels are required to be notified of the rezoning request.

The Comprehensive plan further land use map indicates this area as low density residential.

I have included a portion of Iowa Code 414 City Zoning that describes the City's authority to implement zoning rules, regulations and districts and the process that must be followed. I would highly recommend a privacy fence or some type of shrubbery be required to be installed between the occupied dwelling unit and storage units.

IOWA CODE CHAPTER 414 CITY ZONING (not in its entirety)

414.1 BUILDING RESTRICTIONS -- POWERS GRANTED.

1. For the purpose of promoting the health, safety, morals, or the general welfare of the community or for the purpose of preserving historically significant areas of the community, any city is hereby empowered to regulate and restrict the height, number of stories, and size of buildings and other structures, the percentage of lot that may be occupied, the size of yards, courts, and other open spaces, the density of population, and the location and use of buildings, structures, and land for trade, industry, residence, or other purposes

414.2 DISTRICTS.

For any or all of said purposes the local legislative body, hereinafter referred to as the council, may divide the city into districts, including historical preservation districts but only as provided in section 303.34, of such number, shape, and area as may be deemed best suited to carry out the purposes of this chapter; and within such districts it may regulate and restrict the erection, construction, reconstruction, alteration, repair, or use of buildings, structures, or land. All such regulations and restrictions shall be uniform for each class or kind of buildings throughout each district, but the regulations in one district may differ from those in other districts.

414.3 BASIS OF REGULATIONS.

The regulations shall be made in accordance with a comprehensive plan and designed to preserve the availability of agricultural land; to consider the protection of soil from wind and water erosion; to encourage efficient urban development patterns; to lessen congestion in the street; to secure safety from fire, flood, panic, and other dangers; to promote health and the general welfare; to provide adequate light and air; to prevent the overcrowding of land; to avoid undue concentration of population; to promote the conservation of energy resources; to promote reasonable access to solar energy; and to facilitate the adequate provision of transportation, water, sewerage, schools, parks, and other public requirements. However, provisions of this section relating to the objectives of energy conservation and access to solar energy do not void any zoning regulation existing on July 1, 1981, or require zoning in a city that did not have zoning prior to July 1, 1981. Such regulations shall be made with reasonable consideration, among other things, as to the character of the area of the district and the peculiar suitability of such area for particular uses, and with a view to conserving the value of buildings and encouraging the most appropriate use of land throughout such city.

414.4 ZONING REGULATIONS, DISTRICT BOUNDARIES, AMENDMENTS.


The council of the city shall provide for the manner in which the regulations and restrictions and the boundaries of the districts shall be determined, established, and enforced, and from time to time amended, supplemented, or changed. However, the regulation, restriction, or boundary shall not become effective until after a public hearing at which parties in interest and citizens shall have an opportunity to be heard. The notice of the time and place of the hearing shall be published as provided in section 362.3, except that at least seven days notice must be given and in no case shall the public hearing be held earlier than the next regularly scheduled city council meeting following the published notice.

414.5 CHANGES -- PROTEST.


The regulations, restrictions, and boundaries may, from time to time, be amended, supplemented, changed, modified, or repealed. Notwithstanding section 414.2, as a part of an ordinance changing land from one zoning district to another zoning district or an ordinance approving a site development plan, a council may impose conditions on a property owner which are in addition to existing regulations if the additional conditions have been agreed to in writing by the property owner before the public hearing required under this section or any adjournment of the hearing. The conditions must be reasonable and imposed to satisfy public needs which are directly caused by the requested change. In case, however, of a written protest against a change or repeal which is filed with the city clerk and signed by the owners of twenty percent or more of the area of the lots included in the proposed change or repeal, or by the owners of twenty percent or more of the property which is located within two hundred feet of the exterior boundaries of the property for which the change or repeal is proposed, the change or repeal shall not become effective except by the favorable vote of at least three-fourths of all the members of the council. The protest, if filed, must be filed before or at the public hearing. The provisions of section 414.4 relative to public hearings and official notice apply equally to all changes or amendments.

414.6 ZONING COMMISSION.

In order to avail itself of the powers conferred by this chapter, the council shall appoint a commission, to be known as the zoning commission, to recommend the boundaries of the various original districts, and appropriate regulations and restrictions to be enforced therein. Where a city plan commission already exists, it may be appointed as the zoning commission. Such commission shall, with due diligence, prepare a preliminary report and hold public hearings thereon before submitting its final report; and such council shall not hold its public hearings or take action until it has received the final report of such commission. After the adoption of such regulations, restrictions, and boundaries of districts, the zoning commission may, from time to time, recommend to the council amendments, supplements, changes, or modifications.



AN ORDINANCE REPEALING CHAPTERS 13.04 SEWER REGULATIONS, 13.08 SEWER RATES, 13.10 INDUSTRIAL WASTE PRETREATMENT AND 13.14 INDUSTRIAL COST RECOVERY IN THEIR ENTIRETY AND ADOPTING NEW AND REVISED CHAPTERS 13.04 SEWER REGULATIONS, 13.08 SEWER RATES, 13.10 INDUSTRIAL WASTE PRETREATMENT AND 13.14 INDUSTRIAL COST RECOVERY

WHEREAS previously, the City Council of the City of Keokuk passed and adopted Chapters 13.04 Sewer Regulations, 13.08 Sewer Rates, 13.10 Industrial Waste Pretreatment And 13.14 Industrial Cost Recovery; and

WHEREAS, the City Council now finds it is desirable to update the above-mentioned Chapters to meet the current and future regulatory requirements and to update and clarify the enforcement requirements of the Pretreatment Program to comply with the Iowa Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Agency Enforcement Response Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that in that in order to update and clarify definitions and current and future regulatory requirements and enforcement requirements it is desirable to repeal in their entirety Chapters 13.04 Sewer Regulations, 13.08 Sewer Rates, 13.10 Industrial Waste Pretreatment and 13.14 Industrial Cost Recovery and to adopt new Chapters 13.04 Sewer Regulations, 13.08 Sewer Rates, 13.10 Industrial Waste Pretreatment And 13.14 Industrial Cost Recovery;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KEOKUK, COUNTY OF LEE, STATE OF IOWA AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 13.04–Sewer Regulations adopted by the City Council, City of Keokuk, said Chapter adopted by Ordinance Numbers 1570, 1374, 1422 and 1698, is hereby repealed in its entirety.

SECTION 2. A replacement Chapter 13.04-Sewer Regulations, as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, is hereby adopted as Chapter 13.04-Sewer Regulations.

SECTION 3. Chapter 13.08–Sewer Rates adopted by the City Council, City of Keokuk, said Chapter adopted by Ordinance Numbers 1853, 1422, 1857, 1943, 1955, 1970, 1981, 1836, 1374, 1956, 1735, 1968, is herein repealed in its entirety.

SECTION 4. A replacement Chapter 13.08-Sewer Rates, as set forth in Exhibit B attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, is hereby adopted as Chapter 13.08-Sewer Rates.

SECTION 5. Chapter 13.10–Industrial Waste Pretreatment adopted by the City Council, City of Keokuk, said Chapter adopted by Ordinance Numbers 1959 and 1997, is hereby repealed in its entirety.

SECTION 6. A replacement Chapter 13.10-Industrial Waste Pretreatment, as set forth in Exhibit C attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, is hereby adopted as Chapter 13.10-Industrial Waste Pretreatment.

SECTION 7. Chapter 13.14—Industrial Cost Recovery adopted by the City Council, City of Keokuk, said Chapter adopted by Ordinance Number 1374, is hereby repealed in its entirety.

SECTION 8. A replacement Chapter 13.14-Industrial Cost Recovery, as set forth in Exhibit D attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, is hereby adopted as Chapter 13.14–Industrial Cost Recovery.

SECTION 9. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE – If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 10. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This Ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

- 1. Elkem Brownfield Site: Staff had a meeting with Alliant Energy to discuss the installation of a solar field on the closed landfill. Alliant would install the solar arrays and place the power on the grid. This would allow them to capture tax credits, while in return the City would receive rent for the property.
