



Our Adoption Process

Please take a few moments to read the following explanation for our adoption policies and the steps that make up the process. You may be surprised to find that adopting an animal is a more involved process than you expected or that it means you can't have immediate access to an animal you are interested in. Therefore, it's important to understand the process is the same for everyone. Everything we do is in the best interest of the animals in our care, and is aimed at giving them the best possible chance of finding a permanent home.

HERE ARE THE STEPS YOU'LL GO THROUGH IN THE ADOPTION PROCESS:

- Before you can adopt any animal you've seen in our facility, you will need to fill out the
 adoption application. This paperwork must be completed first in order to minimize stress for
 you and the animals. Our application includes questions pertaining to the adopter's identity,
 other pets in the home, veterinary contact information, as well as questions about how you
 would solve any issues that may arise and what the adopted pets home life will look like in your
 home. This allows us to find the best possible homes for the animals we care for.
- Once the adoption application has been completed we will process that application. We will
 complete this process as quickly as possible. You will be notified when your application has
 been approved.
- Once your application has been approved and you come to pick up your new pet, you will be
 asked the sign the adoption contract and pay the adoption fee. This fee covers the animals
 spay/neuter surgery, vaccines, deworming, and flea prevention. If you are adopting an animal
 too young to be spayed/neutered prior to adoption you will be required to sign the spay/neuter
 contract and leave a refundable deposit.

Adoption fees are \$125 for dogs/puppies and \$100 for cats/kittens.
